

On Tuesday, April 11, 2017, Microsoft sunset all desktop operating systems, which do not support TLS 1.2.

In order to enhance our security to align with industry requirements, and maintain the highest standards for our data security, Sterling Bank will begin disabling TLS 1.0 and 1.1 in a phased approach across our organization.

To prepare for this change, you will need to ensure you are using operating systems and browsers supporting TLS 1.2. Below is a basic TLS 1.2 compatibility chart.

Microsoft Edge	Compatible by default
Microsoft IE Desktop and mobile version 11	Compatible by Default
Microsoft IE Desktop versions 9 and 10	Compatible when run in Windows 7 or newer, but not enabled by default
Firefox 27 and Higher	Compatible by default
Google Chrome 38 and higher	Compatible by default
Mobile Safari versions 5 and higher	Compatible by default
Microsoft Windows Server 2008 R2 and higher	Compatible by Default
Microsoft Windows Server 2008 and below	Not compatible with TLS 1.2
Microsoft Windows 7, 8.0, 8.1, and 10	Compatible by default
Microsoft XP/Vista and below	Not compatible with TLS 1.2
